The district has two primary schools that serve grades K - 2, the Intermediate School for grades 3-6 and the High School for grades 7-12. Thanks to a recent renovation project, the district provides excellent facilities for all its students. The High School features an athletic complex that includes an all-weather track, a lighted synthetic turf football stadium and a lighted baseball stadium. The Intermediate School houses a swimming pool.

A full range of courses are available at the High School level, including Advanced Placement courses and a variety of electives. An inclusion model for Special Education is in place at all levels.

The district has a strong commitment to the use of instructional technology. Curriculum and staff development keep pace with our software and hardware purchases.
